Way BEK When...

"If you want to give me a present, give me a good life. That's something I can value." (East of Eden - 1955)



At the close of 1954, the December headlines of the Steele Ozone announced "\$1,499,000 Govt. Loan Granted BEK Telephone." This procured a vision of a good life ahead for many rural people.

The same year Walt Disney opens a \$17 million amusement park in Anaheim, California, BEK enters 1955 with money in the bank and construction plans of connecting 1,764 subscribers and building 1,330 miles of new line. The first McDonalds opens in Des Plaines, IL as construction begins in Dawson, Hazelton, Kintyre, Moffit, Pettibone, Robinson, Tuttle, Wing and an area between Menoken and McKenzie.

As plant construction proceeded, a lot was going on behind the scenes for the Cooperative. A large part of the early work of the Cooperative involved negotiating for the purchase of other exchanges, purchasing office equipment and telephones, building lines, securing easements and billing. There were setbacks such as the ice storm in November of '56 causing lines to sag and some to break. Meanwhile another construction crew was given their work

orders by Congress (with the Federal Highway Act) to lay 41,000 miles of interstate highways. There was new construction going on all across the country as Dwight D. Eisenhower was re-elected President.

Everywhere you looked, there was construction and exploration; it was crazy; you might say it was "out of this world." The Soviets launched their first man-made satellite, Sputnik I into orbit around the Earth in 1957. The same year, Sputnik II was launched with a canine passenger named Laika. Not to be outdone, the United States launched its first satellite, Explorer I in 1958 and the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) was established to direct nonmilitary space activities. The "doors" were left wide open to space exploration as BEK held Open House ceremonies to dedicate its new headquarters building in Steele.

So much was happening at the close of the "nifty" 50's. Our country grew as Alaska and Hawaii (the 49th and 50th states) entered the Union. Communications were rapidly changing. People kept abreast of current affairs through newspaper, radio and the increasingly popular television. In an effort to keep its Cooperative members informed of company affairs, new listings and profiles of employees and board members, BEK sent out its first newsletter, the "BEK Beacon" in 1959 and it became a monthly publication.

Til' next time, as Roy and Dale would sing, "Happy trails to you, until we meet again."

REMINDER

On February 17, 2009, local off-air TV stations will cease broadcasting in analog and switch to digital signals.

'Analog' TV sets not connected to cable, satellite or other pay TV service (in other words, TVs that use an antenna or rabbit ears for over-the-air TV) will need a digital converter box after Feb. 17.

The federal government is offering discount coupons for viewers who need to purchase converter boxes for analog TV sets. Currently, coupon requests are being taken, but put on a waiting list until more funding becomes available. Capital Credits and Taxes

On June 2, 2008, BEK Communications Cooperative issued over 2,320 capital credit checks to their members for over \$701,634. The 2008 General Retirement consisted of 100% of 1995 capital credits.

BEK capital credit payments are normally not taxable unless the phone service that produced the capital credits was deducted as a business expense. If phone services were claimed as business expenses, the cash received should be reported as income in the year it was paid out. However, it should only be reported in the same proportion as the phone service expense had been deducted. Consult with your tax preparer for further information.

BEK Communications Cooperative will be issuing 1099's for capital credit refunds of \$600 or more paid in 2008.

10 Scholarships Available to 2009 High School Graduates

In support of continuing education for rural youth, BEK Communications is proud to sponsor four scholarship programs for graduating seniors. To qualify, the applicants' parents must be subscribers of BEK Communications.

Applications for the following scholarships may be obtained from your school counselor, online at www.bektel.com or requested from BEK Communications at 1-888-475-2361.

- Up to three - **\$500 Academic Scholarships** to students who enroll in an accredited college or university.
- Up to three - **\$500 Technical Scholarships** for students interested in pursuing a post-secondary education in a vocational or technical field.
- Up to three - **\$500 Broadcasting Scholarships** for students who have completed training in BEK's broadcasting program, have participated in at least one live event and are enrolled in an accredited college, vocational or technical post secondary education school.

These scholarships will be awarded to high school seniors graduating in 2009 and will be applied to their first year as a college student. Applications must be post-marked or delivered to the BEK office **no later than March 13, 2009.**

- **The Foundation for Rural Service (FRS) Scholarships.** There are 30 national scholarships available. Should a student from our service area be selected, BEK will contribute an additional \$500 to the scholarship, for a total one-time scholarship award of \$2,500. It should be noted that preference will be given to individuals expressing an interest in returning to a rural area to work following graduation. Applications are available from your Guidance Counselor or can be downloaded from the FRS web site at <http://www.frs.org>. Completed applications should be sent directly to FRS, postmarked **no later than March 1, 2009***. Applications postmarked after March 1st will not be accepted.

** BEK would advise applicants to have their FRS Scholarship applications postmarked by Friday, February 27, 2009, as rural post offices have shorter hours on Saturdays.*
