Important Notice from BEKTV

On October 4 – 16, 2009 from approximately 1:30 to 4:15 p.m. each day, you may see programming outages on BEKTV due to "sun outages."

During these "sun outages," there will be a brief interruption of service, usually less than 10 minutes.

Not So Way BEK When...

If you were in high school in the 90's or you were a parent or even a grandparent of a 90's student, you will remember "Air Jordan" and you can just picture that number 23 red Chicago Bulls jersey cruising down the basketball floor, driving through the lane and flying through the air to dunk the ball.

1995: On October 3, 1995, BEK recognized 43 years of incorporation and the world watched as "the trial of the century" jury returned a verdict of "not guilty" for O.J. Simpson. Also in 1995, Equal Access became available for out of state long distance, BEK offered Internet service and Microsoft released Windows 95.

1996: Rather than play with the new Pokéman on Game Boy, Jon Benét Ramsey's childhood consisted of fashion, make-up and the spotlight. Tragically the young beauty pageant contestant was found murdered in her parents' basement. BEK Communications gained 3623 access lines in 1996 when the Steele, Linton, Napoleon, Wishek, Lehr and Zeeland exchanges were purchased from US West.

1997: A disastrous flood hit the Red River Valley in the Spring. The view from the air was unbelievable with water and devastation everywhere. Signs on I-94, county and rural roads warned motorists of flooded or blocked roads. Soon everyone was pretty sick of the situation. * Any term agreements will be extended by the number of months your service is on vacation status.

When using BEK's Vacation Plan, all services will be included. You may choose to place your service(s) under the vacation rate plan for a minimum of one month up to a maximum of 12 months.
